Why Commemorate a Fire?

Thank you for joining us for this special historical service. This week I spoke with a journalist about the proceedings. She asked me why we were holding the service. It is a fair question. Why commemorate an event that involved loss, sadness, devastation?

There are several reasons. First, Christian faith does not deny or downplay difficult times. Our current Lenten journey through the desert to the cross is one expression of how suffering catalyzes spiritual learning. One of the core educational tasks of Christianity is teaching us how to respond to trials.

Second, the parish's immediate response to the 1955 fire shows, in real time, what a mature Christian community looks like. While Anglicans are familiar with the veneration of Christian lives from a long ago, this incident gives us a much more recent and relatable ideal of what a church can be. The parishioners of 1955 worked together and sacrificed. They gave as an act of love. That is an inspiration to us, their successors.





Third, this event is an example of the importance of hope. Our predecessors rebuilt in anticipation of future generations worshipping here at the Junction. As St John's Camberwell moves into a new season of ministry, we can do so trusting God's promise to be with us remains as relevant now as it was then. We might even be inspired to dream, as they did, about the legacy we will leave for people 70 years from now, in the year 2095.

Offering to Benefit Fire-Damaged Synagogue

Today's offering will benefit Congregation Adass Israel whose synagogue in Ripponlea was firebombed in December 2024. After prayerful discussion, we, your vicar and churchwardens, agreed that this donation was appropriate as it resonates with the destruction of our church building by arson 70 years ago.

In the past 70 years, Australia's cultural and religious diversity have become more apparent. Recently, however, social cohesion and the "common good" (see today's Nehemiah reading) are under great strain. Tensions in our local communities have especially peaked during the Israel-Palestine conflict. Physical threats to mosques and synagogues are one byproduct of this.

While governments have a responsibility to protect all citizens, faith communities can do work in building solidarity that governments cannot accomplish. During Lent, Christians also acknowledge that faith communities can do harm by ignoring social fragmentation.

St John's Camberwell aspires to be a church connected to its community. One expression of this is interfaith and intercultural engagement. For example, this Friday, our vicar attended an iftar (Ramadan dinner) at a local mosque. Also, at the recent induction service, a rabbi was present. There is much more we can do to bring about harmony and peace (*shalom*, *salaam*), and today's offering is a start.

Christians share much religious history with Muslims and Jews. While key differences remain, we trust that more good comes from valuing each other than fearing each other.

God our refuge and strength, you have bound us together in a common life: help us, in the midst of our present conflict to confront one another without hatred or bitterness to listen for your voice amid competing claims and to work together with mutual forbearance and respect; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
